INTRODUCTION TO YOUR SUPERVISED VISITATION

What is Supervised Visitation?

Supervised Visitation shows the Court that a parent can have a comfortable relationship with their child. Your Family Monitor will facilitate, and schedule the supervised visitation including location and time. Family Monitors observe visitations and prepare written reports for the Court for each visitation session. The Court determines when supervised visitation can become normal time sharing.

Family monitors cannot make recommendations, but they can refer you to resources in your community. Call Infoline at 2-1-1 for assistance with any needs about your health and household needs.

What To Expect During Your Visitation Time (Supervised Time Sharing)

Intakes are required for each parent and guardian so that the family monitor can learn about your goals for visitation.

We know this is a stressful time for all parties, and try to be mindful of everyone's concerns and preferences.

The family monitor acts as the child's temporary guardian during visitation, and strives to adjust the factors of location, time, and frequency most amenable to all parties including the child's interest and abilities.



Benefits of Supervised Visitation

- Family monitors will do their best to make the visitation time enjoyable and fun, meaningful, and loving.
